

#### LORDSHIP FATHERS CLUB PRESENTS...

In case you missed it, the LFC debuted a new event in May – a concert series titled "M is for Music". Each month that contains the letter 'M' will feature a live concert held on a Sunday afternoon at the Lordship Community Church. The May concert featured Lordship resident Larry Haddad leading a jazz quintet comprised of some excellent musicians from the area and New York City. Besides featuring Larry on alto saxophone, the band featured Jacob Varmus on trumpet, Nobuki Takamen on guitar, Preston Murphy on acoustic bass, and Barry Ries on drums (Barry is also an accomplished trumpet player, and has performed with some of the legends of jazz including Horace Silver, Joe Lovano, and countless others.)

The concert held on Sunday May 21<sup>st</sup>, was attended by a number of families and music fans that fine spring afternoon. Attendees were treated to 3 original compositions by Larry, as well as jazz standards by Dexter Gordon, Charles Mingus, Tadd Dameron, and even a "modern" classic by Pharrell Williams – the very popular "Happy". Many in the audience completed a survey, and the feedback was guite positive, with unanimous support for this event and future musical events sponsored by the LFC. After the concert a parent appreciated the "Q & A" that her daughter had after the concert with Jake, the trumpet player. It quickly occurred to us that beyond the opportunity to hear live music performed by top professionals, these concerts also offer a learning opportunity – especially to the budding musicians in the audience. Going forward, we will be including a formal "Q & A", post concert. This will be optional, of course, but we encourage you to stay and ask questions of the performers and take advantage of their knowledge and experience.

We are very much looking forward to the upcoming concerts. On September 21<sup>st</sup>, Jacob Varmus will be back leading his own sextet of New York based musicians, and performing original music from his latest recording project. Next, on November 16<sup>th</sup>, the Saxtet will be performing. The Saxtet is a band comprised of a "big band" saxophone section (2 tenor saxophonists, 2 alto saxophonists, and a baritone saxophonist), plus a rhythm section of piano, bass, and drums. Led by Milford native, Darren Litzie, the band performs his original arrangements of a variety of jazz standards. We will also be holding a holiday themed concert in December; final details will be announced soon.

#### **READY...SPELL?**

The LFC sponsored the 56<sup>th</sup> annual spelling bee on Wednesday, May 21<sup>st</sup> in the Lordship School all purpose Richard Diedrichsen and Janet Warren, both former LFC spelling bee participants, whose children also competed as sixth graders, conducted the event. The contest was open to all Lordship School sixth graders (regardless of where they reside), as well as all Lordship children in grade six at other schools or who are homeschooled. The top five contestants were all awarded cash prizes, with the 1<sup>st</sup> Prize winner receiving \$50. The annual event has attracted as many as 96 contestants, and has become a fond memory and rite of passage for participants, their parents, and teachers. While few former students remember who the winner was, everyone seems to remember the word that eliminated them, and they are careful to spell that word correctly for the rest of their lives! Many thanks to moderator Rich Diedrichsen who has helped deliver this event to our Lordship community for 40 years – a tremendous commitment to say the least!

#### A BIT OF LORDSHIP HISTORY....

The first inhabitants of Lordship were the Paugussetts, who had encampments at Stratford Point and at Indian Well near the rotary. When the first settlers arrived in 1639, they found that the Paugussetts had used this area to plant corn so there was little clearing necessary.

Originally Lordship, called Great Neck, was a Common Field worked and owned by settlers who returned home to the safety of the palisade fort at night. Richard Mills was the first to build a farmhouse in Great Neck in the western end near present day Second Avenue. It is in connection with his name that the term Lordship is first found, as applied to a meadow on what became known as the Lordship farm. In colonial days, there were a few farms and very little trees on the windswept landscape. Stories abound of pirates, buried treasure, smuggling and the British landing troops on Stratford Point due to its isolation. Lordship would remain an isolated area with a few farms for the next couple of centuries.

In 1815, Captain Samuel Nichols built the oldest house in Lordship on Fourth Avenue with his privateering profits from the War of 1812. The house would become known as the Lordship Manor. In 1822 the first lighthouse was built and the area became known as Stratford Point.

William Hopson would acquire the Manor house and begin the transformation of Lordship into what it is today. He built the road to Bridgeport in the late 1880's and formed the Lordship Park Association in 1896. The LPA would be the largest developer in Lordship before dissolving in 1981. The LPA sold 500 acres in western Lordship to the Wilkenda Corporation in 1911. Both companies worked to develop Lordship into a resort. They built the Lordship Casino in Lordship Center, the Lordship Pavilion, a dance hall, bathing facilities and a tent camp at Lordship Beach. They built a trolley line in 1915 to connect Lordship with Bridgeport. Gradually lots were sold and houses built after World War I. The LPA reacquired the property of the Wilkenda Company in 1922. The Lordship Improvement Association was formed in 1924 and worked with the LPA to design the tree lined medians and donate park land to Stratford. The LPA would donate Russian Beach and Bluffs to the LIA in 1938. The LPA retained possession of the land east of Spruce Street until after World War II, when it started developing to the lighthouse.

Today Lordship remains the recreational center of Stratford with the beaches, golf course and Little League complex at Short Beach. Lordship has three Churches; Lordship Community, Our Lady of Peace and St. Joseph's National. Lordship School built in 1938 on land donated by the residents remains a source of pride for the community. Lordship has always been known for its volunteerism. The Stratford Volunteer Fire Company #3 dates its roots back over 100 years in Lordship. The Lordship Improvement Association has been guiding the development of Lordship since 1924 and maintains Russian Beach and Bluffs.

The Lordship Fathers Club has served Lordship since 1947.
